

Then & Now

The area now in and around Olive Branch was first inhabited by the Chickasaw. Among the first early European Settlers to the area were Milton Blocker and Stephen Flinn, who purchased a 1,280-acre tract of land from Chickasaw Chief Lush-Pun-Tubby in 1836.

These 1,280 acres comprises the current area of Old Towne Olive Branch, which was originally at the crossroads of several old Chickasaw trails. Pigeon Roost Road became an important transportation route for goods and livestock between Memphis and Holly Springs. As the trip between those cities was a two-day journey, at the halfway point Olive Branch offered travelers lodging for an evening. The large volume of livestock being transported resulted in numerous pens being constructed to hold them for the night. The area became known as "Cowpens."

In the early 1840s, the area was known as "Watson's Crossroads," named after local Methodist Minister, Sam Watson. By the mid-1840s there was enough of a population in the area to merit the establishment of a post office. When asked, the residents of the area selected the name "Olive Branch," which remains the City's name to this day. Olive Branch, Mississippi was incorporated in 1873, and elected Ben Wesson as the first Mayor. His home, the Wesson House, constructed in 1875, stands in Old Towne.

Over the past 30 years, Olive Branch has experienced exponential growth. According to the U.S. Census Bureau statistics, the City's population grew from 3,567 in 1990 to 46,738 in 2022. Part of this growth came through expansion of the City's boundaries by annexation. Since its incorporation as a municipality in 1873, Olive Branch has enlarged its corporate boundaries numerous times by annexation. Olive Branch grew northward to the Tennessee state line in 1990 and west to Malone Road; then South to College and Church Roads in 1996. Prior to 2021, the 1996 annexation had been the City of Olive Branch's largest expansion of its boundaries to include residential and commercial areas. In addition, Olive Branch completed small area growths in 1998 and 2015 of properties for the specific purpose of future industrial sites. Beginning in the early 2000's - and to set the stage for future annexation into growth areas primarily located to the south and east of the boundary established in 1996 - Olive Branch made tangible infrastructure improvements and extended municipal services.

Such infrastructure improvements and services included the acquisition of numerous private utility systems, extensions of the City's utility systems, and the creation of a municipal fire district with protection provided by the City of Olive Branch Fire Department.

Initiated in 2018 and effective May 2021, the City annexed 18.8 square miles with an estimated population of 6,600 residents. This increased the geographical footprint of Olive Branch to 56 square miles with a population that has almost surpassed 50,000 residents.

Excel By 5 is a community-based certification designed to improve a child's overall well-being by age five. The first-of-its-kind in the United States, this program emphasizes the important roles communities play in educating their children during their most formative years—birth to five. Initially funded with a grant from Chevron, Excel By 5 is currently working with thirty-eight communities throughout the state of Mississippi, including the City of Olive Branch. Excel By 5 sets forth a variety of standards involving parent training, community participation, child care and health to help communities focus on supporting young children and their families. The certification process also identifies available resources and existing best practices to help Excel By 5 - Early Childhood Communities reach the goal that all of their children will be ready to learn when they start school at age five. Excel By 5 certification identifies gaps in community resources, promotes community collaboration, volunteerism and economic development. Starting a Business

Automobile Tags

Automobile tags must be purchased annually and are due during the month in which the vehicle is purchased. For new residents, Mississippi State Law requires that vehicles be registered within 30 days of establishing residency. Vehicles purchased new or used from a dealer or individual must be registered within 30 working days. In all cases, license plates must reflect the county of residence of the registered owner. Tags can be obtained at the DeSoto County Tax Collector's Office in Olive Branch. After you have obtained your tags, you will receive annual notification by mail a month before they expire with the option to renew by mail.

Driver's License

New residents of Mississippi must apply for a Mississippi Drivers License within 60 days of becoming a resident of the state. If you have a valid out-of-state license, only a rules, signs, and eye test is required. If your current out-of-state license is expired, a road test may be required. You will be required to show your social security card, proof of residency, and other forms of I.D. when applying for a license. To learn more or to apply, please visit the address below.

City Utilities

The City of Olive Branch bills utility customers monthly for water, natural gas, sewer, garbage, and recycling pick-up in one monthly billing statement. When you apply for your City utility services, you will be required to pay a deposit for your water and gas. This will remain on file for as long as you remain a customer.

Garbage

The City contracts with a third party for garbage pickup once a week and charges per month for each container. You will be given a blue, wheeled garbage cart. We ask that you bag your garbage (preferably in plastic bags) before placing it in the cart. On the day that your garbage is collected, you will need to roll your cart to the street before 7 am and place it on the curb within eighteen inches (18") of the street (not in the street) with the cart handles facing toward your house (remember Handles to House). Additional carts are available. Contact the utilities office to learn more.

**FIND YOUR RUBBISH
PICK UP DAY**



Roadside Rubbish and Tree Limb Collection

Place your Rubbish and/or Tree Limbs at the curb. Public Works will stop by to collect these items. Typically, it takes one week to complete routes. All citizens receive rubbish and tree limb removal for items that are one truckload or less at no charge. Additional loads will result in charges. Learn more at <https://www.obms.us/325/Rubbish>

- Tree limbs and acceptable rubbish must be cut to 6 feet in length or less.
- If possible, pile limbs stacked in the same direction.
- Leaves, grass, mulch, tile, or dirt must be bagged or boxed by the homeowner for the City to implement curbside rubbish pickup.
- City curbside rubbish pickup service is not able to collect garbage, recycling or hazardous waste.
- Please place acceptable debris in one pile on the yard side of the curb, but close enough that the City rubbish truck is able to reach it from the street side.
- For safety reasons, when placing acceptable debris on the curbside, be mindful of the height of surrounding power lines and tree limbs as well as surrounding structures such as cars, mailboxes, street signs, light poles, etc.
- The City rubbish trucks are not able to pick up debris under low power lines or tree branches or items within five feet of structures.
- Be aware of hills and other traffic safety hazard areas. Place acceptable debris in a flat, safe area.
- It is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure that the curbside rubbish debris is appropriately separated so that it can be picked up.
- The City does not pick up for commercial businesses or property such as tree contractors or apartment complexes.

It's a Toilet; not a Trashcan!

The Water/Sewer Division of the Public Works and Engineering Department have teamed up to launch a digital education campaign regarding what not to flush to preserve the longevity of the City's Water Lift Stations. Due to an uptick of items that should not be flushed, the City is asking all of its residents to remember: "It's a toilet; not a trash can!"

Anything besides human waste and toilet paper has the potential to clog up your home, business, and the City's pipes.

What not to flush:

All of these items have recently been removed during clogs at the City Pump Stations.

disposable diapers
facial tissues

feminine hygiene products
condoms
grease

cotton swabs
band-aids
dental floss

cat litter
cigarette butts
medical syringes



You **must** obtain a permit to put up a fence, place a detached accessory building, or pool in your yard. It is important to remember there may be a potential danger lurking just beneath the surface. Electric, gas, water, and sewer lines can be buried as little as six to twelve inches deep. All utility lines, when cut, will cost you money and potentially your life.

Code Enforcement & Property Maintenance FAQs

What are the most common Code Enforcement violations?

High Grass / Weeds

It is unlawful for any person who owns or is in charge of any lot or parcel of land in the city not zoned for agricultural use to allow weeds and grasses to grow to such a height as to become a health and safety issue. (State law reference MCA 1972, § 21-19-11)

Discarded Materials/ Debris

The use of any yard area for the accumulation of used, discarded, or worn out materials or manufactured products which may or may not be reusable or salable is expressly prohibited. (Litter Ordinance, Section B, Paragraph 8)

Garbage Cart

Carts may be placed at the street between the hours of 6:00 pm of the day preceding the scheduled collection day and 11:59 pm on the scheduled collection day. (Utilities, Section 4, Subsection S, Paragraph 1)

Permit Required

Permits are required but not limited to for fences, storage buildings, home additions, covered patios, gazebos/pergolas, pools, irrigations systems, and finishing out an interior space before sheetrock is installed. (Article XIII, Section 1)

Parking on Unpaved Surfaces

Parking within residential districts: No automobile, truck, trailer, tractor trailer, camper, recreational vehicle, or any other motor vehicle or trailer shall be parked in any yard area, except upon a paved driveway or parking area. (Article XI, Section 4 Pp. D-1)

Improper Signage

Portable signs not permanently affixed to the ground or to a building or structure are not allowed. No signs may be attached to trees, utility poles or street signs. Abandoned or dilapidated signs must be removed. (Article VII Sign Regulations, Section 5)

Fence in Disrepair

It is the property owner's responsibility to maintain any fence located upon their property. (Article VII, Section 2 – Pp. A.8)

Non-Compliant Vehicle

Inoperable or junk vehicles, cars, recreation equipment, and trailers of any kind or type shall not be parked or stored on any residentially zoned property other than in a completely enclosed building. (Article XI, Section 4 Pp. D-2)

What is the Property Maintenance Code?

A set of regulations designed to address blighted properties in the City and to prevent blight from spreading. It is intended to preserve property values and economic attractiveness in our neighborhoods and to discourage criminal activity.

When was it adopted and when did it become effective?

It was adopted on November 2, 2021 by the City's Board of Aldermen, with an effective date of January 1, 2022.

What merits a violation under the Property Maintenance Code?

Examples include but are not limited to: 25% or more of missing roof tiles, roof tarps in place more than 60 days, rotten wood, chipping and peeling paint, damaged gutters, downspouts and garage doors, broken windows, damaged fences, sanitation issues, inoperable vehicles, and overgrown grass, weeds and shrubbery. At least two of these conditions must be observed to qualify. (Property Maintenance Ordinance, Section 12)

Does this mean there needs to be two violations on a property for the City to act?

No, if there is an unkept or overgrown yard, inoperable or junk vehicle, or damaged fence, these can be prosecuted under ordinances other than the Property Maintenance Code.

Wesson House

The Wesson House, located on the southwest corner of the Pigeon Roost Avenue/Goodman Road intersection in Olive Branch Mississippi, is one of only three Dedicated Mississippi Landmarks in DeSoto County. The site where The Wesson House is located was included in the two sections of land (Sections, 34 and 35) purchased from Chickasaw Indian Chief, Lush-Pun-Tubby by Milton Blocker and Stephen Flinn more than a century and a half ago on April 13th, 1836.

Bonsai Nursery

Brussel's Bonsai has been a destination for serious bonsai hobbyists for more than 30 years. The facility caters to gardeners, Asian culture enthusiasts, and those interested in growing a piece of history. The nursery now has over 175,000 square feet of greenhouse space devoted to bonsai. In addition to growing trees, the nursery hosts an annual gathering of bonsai enthusiasts called Rendezvous which is held over Memorial Day weekend; internationally recognized teachers (Masters) from around the world and students from all corners of the U.S. Lectures, hands-on workshops and demonstrations highlight the weekend-long event.
