

City of Olive Branch Pleasant Hill Road Improvements



The purpose of the proposed project is to reduce traffic congestion and improve pedestrian mobility on Pleasant Hill Road from Church Road to SR 302 (Goodman Road). An environmental study has been included in the scope of the project to determine and minimize potential environmental impacts as it meets the purpose and need for the alternative selected and approved for the project. The preliminary design and environmental studies for the build alternative are supported by field surveys, geotechnical investigations, drainage analysis, and a traffic signal analysis for the Nail Road intersection.

The build alternative consists of widening the existing 2-lane roadway to provide an additional through lane in each direction, constructing sidewalks on each side of the road throughout most of the project, constructing a storm sewer system to collect stormwater runoff, and adding a traffic signal at Nail Road.

The project is proposed to be constructed in two phases as follows:


- Phase 1 – from Church Road to just north of Nail Road
- Phase 2 – from just north of Nail Road to just south of SR 302 (Goodman Road)

As shown in the schedule below, and pending approval of the build alternative, both phases will run concurrently through the right of way acquisition phase, EXCEPT for construction of Phase 2, which will follow construction of Phase 1 at a later date.

Project Limits Map




Proposed Schedule
